Lectio Divina

For you have been born again . . . through the living and enduring word of God. 1 Peter 1:23

This week our readings invite us into the second movement of *Lectio Divina*, meditation on God's Word. These passages focus on how God's people respond to him in worship.

Monday: Psalm 96, From David's song in 1 Chronicles 16

What are the different responses to God's glory in this psalm? Which response is reflected in your worship this week?

Tuesday: Isaiah 63:7-64:12, Calling out to God

For what does the prophet cry out? Is Isaiah confident God is listening? For what have your prayers been asking God?

Wednesday: Ezra 6:13-22, Getting ready to worship

How did God's people prepare for the dedication of the temple (see also Ezra 3:7-13)? How is God preparing you for your next adventure in worship?

Thursday: John 4:1-26, Spirit and Truth

What were Samaritan woman's misconceptions about worship? How did she express her worship in her brand new relationship with Jesus? How has your worship matured since you first met Jesus?

Friday: 1 Corinthians 14:26-40, Orderly worship

How is the tension between the ecstatic and prophetic gifts still being worked out in the church? How is God preparing you for both expressions in your worship?

Saturday: Revelation 5, Worship before the Throne

Every creature is worshiping! How does this picture inspire your worship? your involvement in God's mission?
