But you, O Sovereign Lord, deal well with me for your name's sake; out of the goodness of your love, deliver me. For I am poor and needy, and my heart is wounded within me. Psalm 109:21–22

### Learning from imprecatory psalms

For the director of music. Of David. A psalm.

- O God, whom I praise, do not remain silent,
- for wicked and deceitful men have opened their mouths against me; they have spoken against me with lying tongues.
- With words of hatred they surround me; they attack me without cause.
- In return for my friendship they accuse me, but I am a man of prayer.
- They repay me evil for good, and hatred for my friendship.
- <sup>6</sup> Appoint an evil man to oppose him; let an accuser stand at his right hand.
- When he is tried, let him be found guilty, and may his prayers condemn him.
- 8 May his days be few; may another take his place of leadership . . . .
- May this be the LORD's payment to my accusers, to those who speak evil of me.

Psalm 109

- 1. Even this lament psalm has "Hallelujah!" bookends
- 2. This Christ-centered psalm invites us into the Jesus' experience with Judas and Satan (see 109:4, 8)
- 3. The middle section (109:6-20) express the Righteous One's experience of evil it really is Satan!
- 4. This psalm invites us to be wrapped in the garment of praise rather than bitterness

## The good mercy of God

- <sup>21</sup> But you, O Sovereign LORD, deal well with me for your name's sake; out of the goodness of your love, deliver me.
- For I am poor and needy, and my heart is wounded within me . . . .
- I am an object of scorn to my accusers; when they see me, they shake their heads.

Psalm 109

- 1. God's *hesed* mercy (or, faithful love) is equal parts affection, generosity and covenant (thanks, Nick!)
- 2. God's mercy is  $t\bar{o}v$  because it fulfills his purpose in our lives
- 3. This "first person" account only makes sense in the shadow of the cross

## A new way of seeing God

- Help me, O LORD my God; save me in accordance with your love.
- Let them know that it is your hand, that you, O LORD, have done it.
- They may curse, but you will bless; when they attack they will be put to shame, but your servant will rejoice.
- My accusers will be clothed with disgrace and wrapped in shame as in a cloak.

Psalm 109

- 1. This strophe begins with Yahweh, El, yasa', and hesed all in one line of verse
- 2. Even in an imprecatory psalm, there is still room for the lost to respond to what God is doing
- 3. We are either wrapped in Jesus' righteousness or wrapped in our own shame

<sup>14</sup> Rather, clothe yourselves with the Lord Jesus Christ, and do not think about how to gratify the desires of the sinful nature.

Romans 13:14

#### **Getting to praise**

- With my mouth I will greatly extol the LORD; in the great throng I will praise him.
- For he stands at the right hand of the needy one, to save his life from those who condemn him.

Psalm 109

- 1. This is praise  $m'\bar{o}d$  that draws me into the community of "Hallelujah!"
- 2. In Book 5, we don't get to the Hallel, the Torah, the Ascents or the doxology until we meet Messiah! (see the poster below)
- 3. The salvation here points directly to Jesus, *Yeshu'a* and he comes to stand at my right hand!
