The human condition

The Lord smelled the pleasing aroma and said in his heart, "Never again will I curse the ground because of man, even though every inclination of his heart is evil from childhood."

- 2) Moses re-tells the story THE FALL

There were the three sons of Noah, and from them came the people who were scattered over the earth.*

Noah being human

*Noah, a man of the soil, proceeded to plant a vineyard.
When he drank some of its wine, he became drunk and lay uncovered inside his tent.*

Genesis 9:20

- 1) Vineyard GOOD
- 2) Drunkenness and nakedness BAD

The sins of the fathers

Ham, the father of Canaan, saw his father's nakedness

But Shem and Japheth took a garment and laid it across their shoulders; then they walked in backwards

Genesis 9:22-23

- 1) Fathers MATTER
- 2) HONORING OUR FATHER AND MOTHER matters more

A word for Canaan, Shem and Japheth

When Noah awoke from his wine and found out "Cursed be Canaan . . . !"

"Blessed by the Lord, the God of Shem" "May God extend the territory of Japheth"
