
1. Joseph's kindness reveals his brothers' repentance

## **Joseph is looking forward**

*By faith Joseph, when his end was near, spoke about the exodus of the Israelites from Egypt and gave instructions about his bones.*

Hebrews 11:22

1. Joseph gives us the first appearance of remnant theology (see Isaiah 37:32)
2. God is at work -- but we should be identifying with the brothers!
